

















This gelatin dry plate photograph of the Peixateries Velles bridge in Girona demonstrates how direction and perspective can work wonders for otherwise trivial scenes. When trying to take in this picture's many elements and details, our eyes are guided by strong lines and patterns that help us "find our way" through the scene.







Pictures in Focus: Lover's Lane by John Topham

John Topham was a British documentary photographer who captured a changing Britain. Today, PHOTOCONSORTIUM's Fred Truyen introduces us to Topham's *Lover's Lane*, 1938, as his Picture of the Month.

Today, John Topham's collections are managed by the British picture library TopFoto. My friend John Balean, who works there, did some research and found a print of this image with a caption reading 'A young couple head for Lovers Lane but only find a dead end to the Swanscombe Paper Mill – 23 March 1938'. In that era, this area of North Kent was rapidly evolving as a consequence of the industrialisation process. The work of John Topham depicting this region is a testimony both to a lost rural world and to industrial prowess. So there is some ambiguity in this choice of subject.

ISSUES

- General findability issues in Europeana when using search box
- Metadata uniformity, quality and specificity
- Photo Collection-specific issues
 - Metadata are not specific for photography
 - Inconsistent use of Techniques
 - We do not have adequate periodisation
 - No tagging possible in current publishing environment

Photographic attributes

- These attributes span traditional photographic principals of color, lighting, focus, and composition, and provide a natural vocabulary for use in applications, such as auto photo editing and image retrieval. Examples:
 - balance, fill the frame, lead room, rule of thirds, motion blur, simple, color harmony, framed, leading lines, shallow DOF, Repetition and pattern symmetry (based on DPChallenge, Flicker, and Unsplash)
 - Interesting content, object emphasis, good lighting, color harmony, vivid color, shallow depth of field, motion blur, rule of thirds, balancing element, repetition, and symmetry

As part of the European Year of Cultural Heritage, Europeana is running a campaign focused on personal stories of migration. Part of the campaign is to create a useful and multilingual vocabulary of migration-related terms that GLAMs can use in their metadata.

There are 61 terms for this migration-vocabulary list. This table tracks the translation status on Wikidata for all official EU languages (plus any other language which wishes to be involved) for their *labels*, *descriptions*, and the *label of their 'subclass of'* property. Join us in bringing all these translations to 100%!





The 61 vocabulary terms are, in no particular order:
