ADSI supports crafts' skills and other skills' (such as marketing & communication skills) development through a pilot programme ("ARSIab: Progetto alternanza scuola/lavoro") that is supported by the Italian Ministry of Education, where university students can do internships in **privately-owned heritage houses** as part of their curriculum.

In Belgium, in 2019, the **Belgian Association of Private Historic Houses** and the **Union of Heritage Craftspeople (UAP)** set up a collaboration where craftspeople offer up to 40 hours of probono restoration works to **private owners of heritage houses** that are members of the Belgian Association of Private Historic Houses.




