



Pastor Petrus Jacobus De Clerck (1742-1831)

 Moved from the Western part of Flanders to study in Leuven



Pastor Petrus Jacobus De Clerck

- Becomes a pastor in 1770 in Veltem
- Buys a house in 1785 and founds the first "school van barmhartigheid" (school of mercy).



Pastor Petrus Jacobus De Clerck


- French revolution (starts in 1789) and Brabant revolution (1790)
- Pastor De Clerck continues his work and becomes archpriest in 1798

• Imprisoned in 1799 in Cambrai (France)





What was Pastor De Clerck's vision?

Free education for the poor kids of the parish, teaching them how to write, read, weave, sew, knit, draw and flay hemp and flax.

He believed in the importance of teaching them the ways of Christianity, personal hygiene and to love working hard.


He provided soup every school day for 40 of the poorest kids in his parish.

- Stimulation at a young age.




From convent to school

Kids from these area do not have to go into Leuven.




Why would we build a school here?

Lane 1

We develop a collection of interactive lessons in which the pupils of the PDC primary school will get to know PDC in an approachable manner.

They will create a presentation to the public about the history and spirituality of PDC.

They will present this around his celebration day in January 2022.***

The pupils will host a guided walk (provided by the Heritage group) through Veltem. They will guide the public around multiple heritage sites, stopping at 4 points to present the sites.

Lane 2

We will develop a website on which the pupils of the primary school will place multiple videos on PDC's history and spirituality.

They will create infographics on the physical heritage that is currently present in the cloister and will remain present when the school opens.

These infographics will be presented on mobile devices through a QR code that visitors and future students can scan with their mobile phones.
