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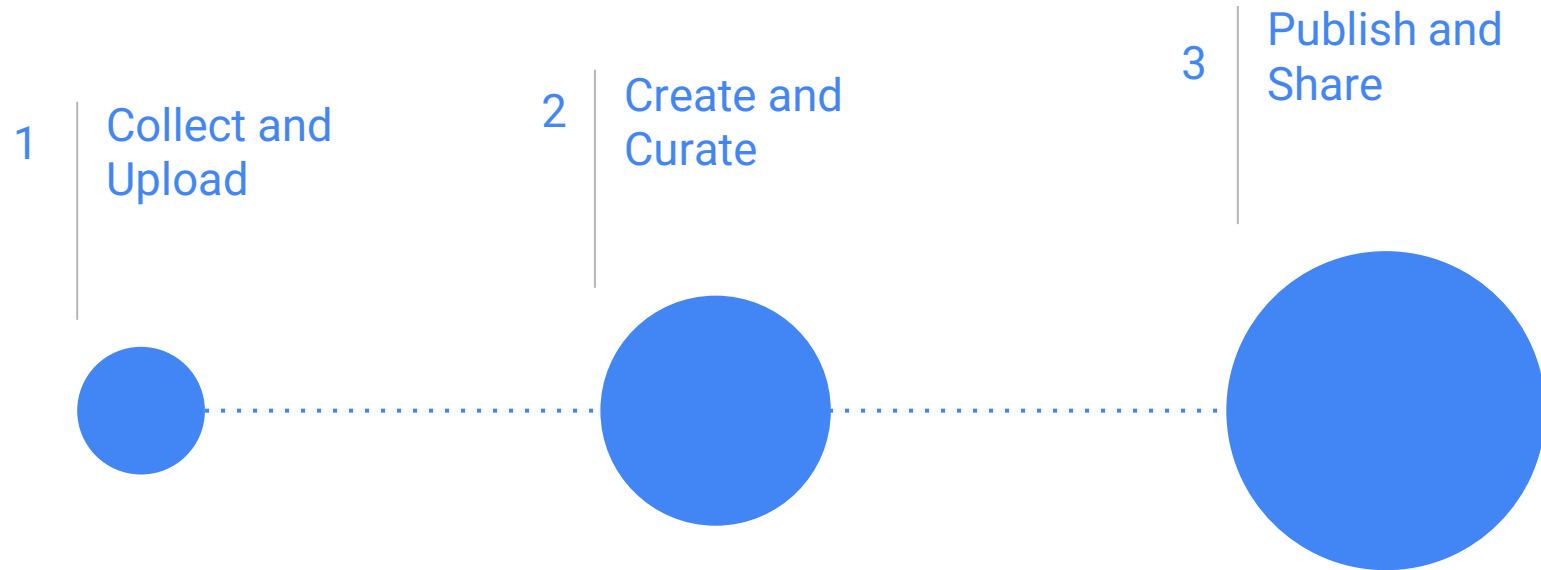

Enabling a holistic documentation of the cultural communities' heritage

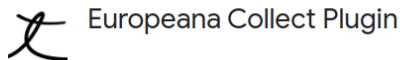
- ★ Opening up existing collections and making them available in new ways

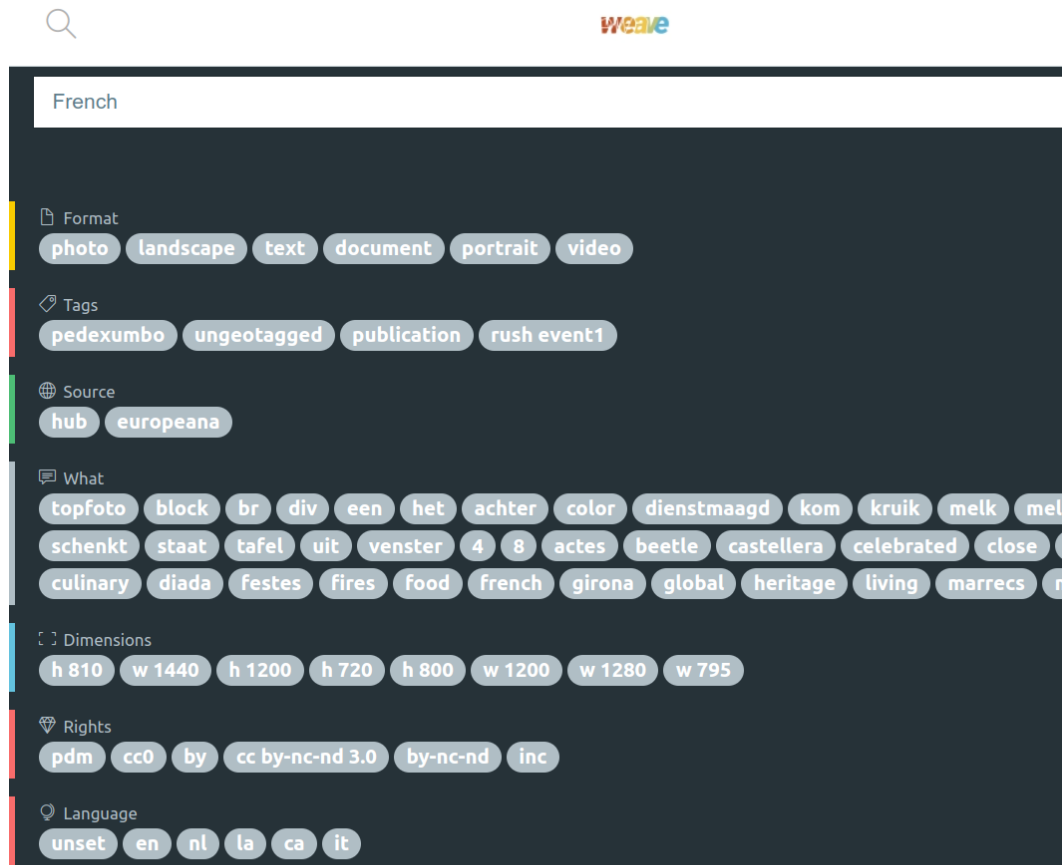
