


Task 4.2 Online Presence and Europeana editorials (Lead: Photoconsortium)







As the interest in intangible heritage is increasing, galleries, libraries, museums and other collection holders are currently investigating which (and how) tangible artefacts can represent traditions, practices, skills and cultural phenomena.

Looking at photographic collections in particular, it's a striking realisation prints or negatives are tangible representations of immaterial narratives, depictions, the images themselves, are recordings of moments that carry tangibility. Ironically, the digital transfer of an image re-renders the tangible carrier into an intangible asset that takes on new life and meaning in the even less material 'cloud'.

Talking about and working with intangible cultural heritage is a challenging and complex process, as the partners in dedicated efforts - such as the <u>WEAVE project</u> - can testify first-hand.

## The Renaissance of Romani Re-presentation

Gypsy, Roma, Traveller communities, images and identities over a millennium



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
For many centuries, stories and imagery around Gypsy, Roma, Traveller communities have reflected mainly external perspectives and misapprehensions. Contemporary artworks and narratives coming from within the communities as well as thousands of historical artefacts now becoming digitally available help to present an accurate representation and paint rich pictures of their past and present.

In this visual essay by historian, researcher, and professor of Romani Studies, Dr Adrian R Marsh, himself of Welsh Gypsy origins, with an afterword from Romani artist and researcher, Imogen Bright Moon, we follow a path from misrepresentation to renaissance, exploring the histories of Gypsy, Roma, Traveller communities and opening a window to their contemporary artistic expressions.

### From Byzantium to the Baltic



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Prior to the 20th century, representation of Romani and Traveller people has been seen exclusively through the eyes of non-Romani artists, writers, and chroniclers (such as <u>Sebastian Münster</u>'s Cosmographia, 1544), even when those writers were reporting Romani words and opinions, through the non-Romani 'gaze'.

Their inevitable distortions, prejudices and frequent stereotypes (often copied directly from previous writers' works) were the frameworks that 'Egyptians' (hence, 'Gypsies')
